The Why:

Foster Care – means instability

- Varied home life
 - emergency care facilities
 - foster homes
 - group homes
 - juvenile detention facilities
- Frequent moves
 - 1-2 per year
 - 10+ times between entering and aging out

This instability in home life results in trauma –

and makes it difficult to establish relationships, succeed in school








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Unlikely to go to college...




Aged Out of Foster Care

- no 4 year college
- attend college, not graduate
- graduate college



- Over 20,000 foster care students age out each year.
- Less than 3% will earn a college degree.
- But more than 80% of ISF students will earn a degree.

- why?





ISF is changing the narrative for youth in three ways:

Scholarships

ISF scholarship funds cover many necessary expenses, allowing students to earn their college degree.

Mentoring

ISF students receive a one-onone mentor to guide them through life decisions, college, and planning for their futures.

Leadership

ISF students can participate in an annual leadership conference in Dallas and are given the opportunity to join a mission trip serving orphans in resource-challenged areas.

23 or under at the time of application


GPA 2.5+

Application: Transcript, essay, fafsa, proof of (foster care) status, recommendation letters

Due April 15th each year



Three prongs to the program:





Scholarships



ISF helps applicants and current students work through their budgets



Required to submit fafsa and get all grants and other funding available (if available)



ISF can provide some funding for any expense required to maintain full time status:

School Tuition, room and board, fees

Equipment: phones, computers, books

Other living expenses: insurance, rent car loans, data plans

Emergency help: medical, dental, car repairs

We pay the bill, not the student



ISF Emergency Fund









Mentoring

- Individual pairings
- Mentors are vetted and trained
- Ongoing resources and check-ins
- ISF received a grant from National Mentoring Resouce Center to work with a partner agency for a year (Silver Lining Mentoring) to better develop mentoring program
- ISF mentor pairings last at least one year, and many continue for several years, lifetime relationships!



Triangle









- Application is on ISF Website:

- Requirements:
 - Short answer questions:
 - Background/demographic
 - School info/where attending, major, career goals
 - · Mentoring past experiences and expectations
 - Budget/needs
- Essay on overcoming obstacles/personal statement
- Photo
- Transcript
- Foster care / ward of the court letter or referral
- Optional Letter of Recommendation





Student Renewals

ISF Students are part of the ISF family for life

Eligible to renew for support for as long as they are full time in school
